The volunteers with Friendship Trays may be the only regular people in regular contact with the individuals served. ATD donated \$40,000 to Friendship Trays.

- **Promising Pages** offers more than 100,000 free books to underserved children every year to cultivate a lifelong love of reading. Promising Pages is Charlotte’s largest and most efficient distributor of upcycled books aimed at addressing the critical – and solvable – community need for books. ATD donated \$40,000 to Promising Pages.
